The success of the people of world war 2. The USA WASPs had a grand impact on WW2. Plus the Tuskegee Airman and their effects on the War. And last, me and my goals that I hope to achieve.

First off, the WASPs were very successful women. These ladies flew a total of 60 million miles in just 16 years! (about 1000 miles each day!) Only 38 out of 2500 WASPs died during the war, and 1074 won their wings. These girls were capable of anything you ask. They flew all 2500 different planes, and accomplished all types of missions (including the ones that the males were assigned) These lassies were awarded the Congressional Gold Medal of 2010 in return for their “Sacrifice, Record, and Revolutionary Reform in the Armed Force.”

The Tuskegee Airmen had the job of escorting bombers throughout World War 2. The Airmen volunteered themselves into this war. These African American men were extremely good at their job. They had one of the lowest loss records of all escort fighters. 150 flying crosses, 774 Air medals, 8 purple hearts, and 14 bronze stars were given. Despite the difference of their skin and low profile the Tuskegee Airmen were good (if not better) than the average white man.
