The Women Airforce Service Pilots was established during World War II, on August 5, 1943. The WASP flew a total of 60 million miles while doing many missions. The organization was formed so that the men could have a break from combat in WW2. In 1942, Nancy Harkness Love created the Women Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS) and Jacqueline Cochran the Women's Flying Training Detachment, then in 1943 they were merged to make WASP.

In January 1941 the War Department formed the all-black 99th Pursuit Squadron of the U.S. Army Air Corps. The men were to be trained using single-engine planes at the segregated Tuskegee Army Air Field at Tuskegee, Alabama. They flew more than 15,000 individual sorties in Europe and North Africa during World War II. Their performance earned them more than 150 Distinguished Flying Crosses, and helped encourage the eventual integration of the U.S. armed forces. The young African Americans who aspired to become pilots met with significant obstacles, starting with the widespread (racist) belief that Black people could not learn to fly or operate sophisticated aircraft.
